A Knight Must be a Man and Stand Tall

Our first commitment must be to ourselves. We have to be honest, believe in God and be ethical, not hide our faith, stand up for what is right. Be true to ourselves. In other words we must practice Charity, Unity and fraternity. Be willing to say what we really think. We should be known for these qualities in all our actions to those with whom we interact.

Be The Man, Be The Knight, God Created You To Be.

Honesty

Honesty includes everything from paying all our taxes, leaving the waitress or chambermaid a tip, returning to the rightful owner what is theirs and most important to be honest in all our dealings. If we owe something to someone else, whether an individual or government, it isn't ours, and must be paid. There are no "white" lies.

A lie is a lie is a lie. Think before you speak. The truth is easier to support than a lie. To some, lying is a habit and an addiction. Don't be one of them. It is impossible to believe a person who has shown they are dishonest. It takes a long time to rebuild the trust.

Believing in God

Believing in God is most important. The prerequisite to believing in God is to understand why we are here, to understand and believe that Jesus Christ gave his life for us because He loves us, as we understand so well as the Passion is being read. We must realize that our entrance to Heaven and joining the Lord means returning His love to those with whom we interact. Ethical:

What is right? What is honest? Be known as a person who is fair and ethical in your personal life with your family and friends as well as in your business dealings. They are not separate. You are ethical or not. You can't have it both ways. I firmly believe you will never lose money in business or personally because you are ethical and treat people fairly and honestly. I say this after running my business for more than 25 years.

Don't hide your faith:

Are you ashamed to have people recognize you as a Christian? Don't deny the Lord lest He deny you. Do you bless yourself in a restaurant, bow your head and thank the Lord for your meal among other things? If not then this is a good time to start. I have had Muslim students in my class that would ask if they could go in the back of the class at noon and pray. I have to respect them for their beliefs.

Support what you believe is right:

You are part of the community. What happens affects you and your family. What issues are important to you? Do you believe in Assisted Suicide? Do you believe in Abortion? Does anyone know what you believe. Do you voice your concerns in your community, to the politicians paid to represent you? Talk to your politician. Tell the person what you believe. Your opinion is important. Stand tall and be counted. If not, don't you think you should?

Be a man in your community:

So many community events rely on people giving of their time and resources for things to happen and it is humbling to see the great generosity of so many people. As a K of C volunteer and with other groups, I have been privileged to meet so many good, generous and kind hearted people it convinces me that we do live in a good, kind and compassionate world. As a man, be involved in your community groups.

'Be a man in your community', continued:

Support them by attending meetings and doing your share of the work. Help with the decisions. So many activities such as food banks, charitable organizations, sport for children and teens and an endless list. As Fourth Degree Knights we must support our community, our province and out country. Give generously of your time and talents by being involved in your community. Do your part with words and actions to make a better place.

Be a man in your workplace:

Be an example in your workplace, So many ways to do this such as being a friend to your other workers, helping the new worker fit in, don't put up with bullying, gossip or sexist comments. Shun the racist in the workplace remembering that we are all equal in the eyes of the Lord. Be careful of workplace politics. Walk away from these discussions. Help to make the workplace pleasant. Show your friends what it means to be a Knight by your example. Everyone is there to make a living, support themselves and their families and not work under stress.

Be a man in your family:

This is last because it is by far the most important. The Lord expects the man, father, husband to be the spiritual leader in the home. Children learn what they live. We bear some responsibility for the next generation.

That being said, my grandfather was a sea captain away for weeks at a time and my father talks about their saying their night prayers at his mother's knee. So often the mother or wife will be spiritual leader in the home.

- The role of the man (father) is to set the religious tone by ensuring that the Lord is known and respected in the home. One way is by everyone going to church together if possible. A discussion of the sermon at Sunday dinner will help make it more relevant and provide some different insights. Saying the rosary every night is a must.
- Saying grace before meals is also a must, holding hands if possible. Say the grace slowly, think about the words. Remember we all have a lot to thank the Lord for. Explaining to our children why we have fish on Friday. Go through parts of the bible with them.
- Last thing at night we should say prayers even if we say them quietly by ourselves. We should thank the Lord for all the
 events of the day. Thank Him for the good as well as the bad things. Remember He has complete control of them so thank
 Him. When we say the Our Father, say it slowly, think about the words. They really are quite powerful. And in the morning say a few prayers to thank the Lord for waking you up to a new day telling Him you will accept and thank Him for whatever the new day holds whether it be good or bad.
- Monitor your families reading material, television shows etc. for pornography. That doesn't belong in the home or anywhere else. Lead by example.
- Talk to your children as they grow up and tell them it isn't cool. Porn of any sort is not justifiable. It's not what the Lord expects of us. He expects better.
- Make time for each family member. Everyone should feel they are important, they are number one. Talk to each one each
 day, find out what is happening at school with their friends. Find something to compliment them on. Make them feel they
 are important to you and the rest of the family. Be restrained with your criticism and compliment more than criticize.
- Don't eat alone. When someone comes home late for supper, sit at the table with them, keep them company during supper, ask them about their day, make them feel they are part of the family. Little things like this make a difference.

- Examine your life honestly. What do you want to change. Ask the Lord for help. He will help you. We can't do this on our own. Change is easy with His help. We will generally have a list of the things we need help with from the Lord.

 the sunset or whatever. Work on building their faith till they realize that the Lord is all powerful and controls our every
 action and destiny. Helping your children believe and grow spiritually is your most important role and the greatest gift you
 can give them.

- If we can put this effort into our families they will end up as good respectful citizens, marry and raise their families with love and have no worries about drugs, alcohol, suicides, divorces, etc.
