The Color Corps is an elective division of the Fourth Degree, whose distinctive presence in parades, wreath-laving ceremonies, and Catholic functions is a visible reminder of our service to the community. The tuxedo, chapeau, cape, and sword worn by the Color Corps were inspired by 19th century naval uniforms, with different cape colors representing nine different program ranks. The ceremonial sword symbolizes Christian Knighthood, and is carried to signify reverence to Church, Eucharist, country, and freedom. Color Corps members wear the colors with pride, knowing they represent the very best of the Knights of Columbus.
